During World War II, Nazi Germany forced c. 13 million Europeans to work for its economy both in the Reich and in the occupied countries. About 100,000 of these modern slaves were Spaniards, the largest part exiled Republicans in France. Most of these *Rotspanier* served in the Organization Todt building the Atlantic Wall, or in the Groups of Foreign Workers of the Vichy regime. Other worked in Germany as deportees, prisoners of war of the French Army, or enrolled more or less freely.

The tragic destiny of the c. 10.000 *Rotspanier* who were deported after 1940 to German concentration camps is fairly well known in present Spain. On the contrary, the history of the Spanish forced workers in World War II has deserved almost no attention by historians and has no presence in the memory of the Spanish people. This conference aims to awake public interest on this facet of Spanish modern history and boost historical research
